Local law enforcement agencies create 3-part public service campaign targeting traffickers, sex buyers and human trafficking victims.

PASCO COUNTY, FL: The <u>Pasco County Commission on Human Trafficking</u> is releasing a public awareness campaign, developed in partnership with all five Pasco County law enforcement agencies. The series of three Public Service Announcement videos features Pasco Sheriff Chris Nocco, Zephyrhills Police Chief Derek Brewer, New Port Richey Police Chief Kim Bogart, Port Richey Police Chief Cyrus Robinson and Dade City Police Chief James Walters.

The videos will be released on all participating agencies' social media platforms on Thursday, October 7, 2021. We appreciate your consideration in liking and sharing these important messages to increase human trafficking awareness.

"These PSAs highlight Pasco County law enforcement's unified front in combatting human trafficking," said Pasco County Commission on Human Trafficking Chair Liana Dean. "This crime will not be tolerated in Pasco, and if you're <u>trafficking</u> or <u>buying sex</u> – law enforcement will track you down."

The PSAs also address <u>human trafficking victims</u> and survivors directly – assuring them that law enforcement cares about them and letting them know help and resources are available.
